

Global Apathy: Rohingya and Palestinian Struggles Expose the Ineffectiveness of the International System

Rohingya refugees facing persecution in Myanmar are enduring perilous sea journeys to reach Indonesia's Aceh province. The recent surge in arrivals, exceeding 1,600 since November, strains Aceh's historical hospitality towards Rohingya refugees. The influx overwhelms local resources, sparking concerns that Indonesia may follow neighbouring countries in denying entry to Rohingya refugees. Government intervention is urged to address the humanitarian crisis, with activists highlighting Indonesia's obligations under the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea. The government, acknowledging the challenges, seeks a balance between humanitarian concerns and national interests while investigating human smuggling.
